## FAW offering 3 free hikes this weekend

The Friends of Allegheny Wilderness (FAW) will offer three free hikes for the Pennsylvania Greenways and Trails Summit beginning this weekend.

All three hikes are open not only to Summit attendees, but also to the public. There is no charge to participate in any of the hikes, but hikers should bring their own food, water, hiking and camping equipment, and come prepared for any weather conditions.
